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### 1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### 1.1 INTRODUCTION

"Uddharedatmanatmanam" (Uplift Thee, Thyself) with this mantra in the hearts the journey of the Jadhavaji Education Society started in the year 1918 in Athani. Earlier it was known as Anglo Vernacular School and then transformed into Jadhavaji Anandaji High School. Since the establishment of the J. E. Society ample of water has flown in the basin of river Krishna and our Institution has grown in many folds.

The Institution celebrated its centenary in the year 2018. From K. G. to P. G. the J. E. Society has 10 Institutions rendering a yeoman service in the field of education in the farthest border area of Karnataka and Maharashtra.

Responding to the needs of the students our society started the degree college in the year 2004. Our proud alumni Shri K. A. Lokapur by his generous donation brought our dream of constructing the college building in reality that is why now the college and the building stand in the name of Shri Krishnarao Annarao Lokapur.

We provide education in Arts, Science, Commerce and B. B. A. Besides, the college offers P. G. Courses in Commerce and M. A. in English since 2013 to nurture higher education in and around Athani. The degree college started in the year 2004 with 128 students' strength. Right now, the student strength is 1188 for the academic year 2022-23. This is a result of the involvement of faculties, students and the management through various activities. The college is private and unaided and purely maintained by self finance since 2004.

The premise of the college has 8 acres of land donated to the J. E. Society by Late Shri Shrimant D. B. Pawar Desai (Mangasulikar). The college infrastructure is adorned by lush greenery, Botanical Garden, Amphitheater, Canteen, Play ground and more. It has magnificent auditorium in the memory of alumni, late Dr|| R. H. Kulkarni.

The college is located in Athani which is rural area of Belagavi District and it is affiliated to Rani Channamma University, Belagavi. The college is accredited with Grade 'B' by the NAAC in its First Cycle in 2015. The University Grant Commission included the college under section 2F and 12B of the UGC Act, in the year 2017.

- The institution has adopted Adahalli Village in Athani Taluka in collaboration with college's NSS unit and Rani Channamma University, Belagavi NSS cell.
- The institution always supports the units of NSS, YRC and Eco-Club to undertake social, economic, cultural and outreach programmes and extensions at regular intervals.
- The student volunteers of NSS and YRC take initiatives regularly to organize extension activities, awareness programmes, procession (jathas) on social issues and donation drives to help the people affected by natural calamities.
- The faculty members of the college publish their research articles in the International Journals under UGC care listed with good impact factor.
- The institution organizes various Faculty Exchange Programmes, Intellectual Property Rights and Entrepreneurship Programmes.

- Various committees and cells actively work to contribute greatly in the holistic development of the students through trainings, workshops, competitions and extracurricular activities.
- The college has achieved its good positions in the cultural activities.
- The college has a prominent position in sports. The college placed many championships, State Level, National Level and University Level Tournaments. Many students are recognized as University Blues by the Rani Channamma University, Belagavi.
- An active Alumni Association is registered under the Karnataka Society's Registration Act 1960 to provide a platform to past students. The college organizes alumni meets regularly.
- Alumni students donated financial support to the 3 needy students.

### Institutional preparedness for NEP

### 1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:

All the courses offered by the affiliating University under the different programs of UG and PG education in our institution are multi/interdisciplinary in nature. These are offered to students of Arts, Science, Commerce and BBA Streams-Environment studies and Digital fluency for B.A, B.Com, B.Sc and B.B.A First year, Artificial Intelligence, India and Indian Constitution and Financial Education and Investment Awareness for B.A, B.Com, B.Sc. and B.B.A, Second year and Cyber Security and Profession Communication for B.A, B.Com, B. Sc and B.B.A Third year. Open Elective Courses (OEC), Skill Enhanced Courses (SEC), Disciplined Specific Courses (DSC) listed by the affiliating University were informed to the students while admitting them to different Programs. Apart from this the certificate, Value added, Skilled based, Outcome based courses introduced in our college.

### 2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) will allow students of undergraduate and Postgraduate degree courses to exit the course and enter within a stipulated period. The flexibility in all our academic programs will help the students to seek employment after any level of award and join back as and when feasible to upgrade qualification. This will reduce the dropout rate and thus help to improve Gross Enrollment Ratio in higher education. The students who were enrolled during the academic year 2021-22 and 2022-2023 were informed about multiple entry and exit options as per NEP 2020. The students enrolled as per NEP guidelines can also get credit transfer for the courses offered by the Government of India through SWAYAM, NPTEL, MOOC etc. The College will introduce integrated education and competency based on courses under NSQF scheme of UGC. These additional courses enhance the students with advanced knowledge, skill development, aptitude etc.

#### 3. Skill development:

A curriculum is designed by affiliating University to enhance skill-based learning for students, besides the institution is already conducting soft skills courses. In order to promote different career paths, the institution conducts courses such as communication skills, computer skills and as the advantage of indulging holistic skill development of the students in higher education. The institution collaborated with two industries nearby town to enhance skill based

	education, and to fulfill Academic Project works.  Apart from this the institution has an MoU with the Deshpande Skilling Hubli to enhance the skill for final year students and the institution has the laboratories to make the students practically capable for industrial or commercial employment.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	The institution is prepared for promoting local language by organizing compulsory Literary activities in the Curriculum in order to increase the integration of Indian languages and its culture among students to fetch extra credits. The Stakeholders of the institution make use of 3 languages Kannada, Hindi and English. Subjects in Arts and Commerce streams are taught in bilingual mode (English and Kannada) and Science subjects are taught in English. However difficult concepts, theories and practical's are explained in Kannada language. The institution takes special efforts to preserve Indian Culture and tradition through various activities such as Traditional Day Celebration, Mehendi, Rangoli, Dance, Singing, Food Festival, etc.
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	Rani Channamma University, Belagavi offered uniformity through outcome-based education curricula for all programs in all the affiliated Colleges. It is recommended to use a variety of approaches in teaching and learning methods including lectures, seminars, workshops, assignments, study tours, etc. The University frames syllabi of all the courses. The University syllabi mention Course Outcomes, Program Specific Outcomes and Course Outcomes are identified and displayed on college websites and on notice boards. Pedagogy is designed and used in teaching- learning practices to achieve the learning outcomes. POs, PSOs and COs are calculated on the basis of direct and indirect methods.
6. Distance education/online education:	To enable the online education, the institution has already taken initiatives, especially during COVID-19 pandemic situation, the teaching and learning process through different online modes like YouTube, WhatsApp, Teachmint and Zoom Cloud Apps, etc. The Internal examinations were conducted through online mode during lockdown periods. National Webinars were organized on current relevant topics. Many of our students along with other college students were benefitted by these

webinars.

1.1.1 The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

### **Response:**

- The college is affiliated to Rani Channamma University, Belagavi devices and implements its curriculum and academic calendar under the guidance of the university at the beginning of the academic year.
- The Academic Calendar is prepared by IQAC at the commencement of the academic year under the guidance of the principal, specifying the significant curricular and co-curricular activities with dates to ensure proper teaching learning and continuous evaluation. The Calendar of events is displayed on notice board and website.
- The various committees are constituted at the commencement of the college. The general meeting is conducted for yearly planning of curricular and co-curricular activities. The departmental meetings are arranged by HOD's at the beginning of each Semester. The Time-Table Committee prepares a master Time-Table and based on the same, the departments prepare departmental and individual Time-Table.
- The university displays the curriculum in its website, the same is distributed in departmental meetings. The subject teachers prepare Teaching Plans with objectives of lessons and teaching pedagogies based on course outcomes of the respective subjects. The Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes are displayed on the college website. The teachers complete the assigned syllabi in the stipulated time. The heads of the departments review the completed syllabi of the faculty in given time in their departmental meetings and all the faculty maintain their work dairies and the same is reviewed by the HoD and Principal in the last week of each semester.
- The faculty update themselves by attending Curriculum Orientation Courses/Programmes and Faculty Development Programmes organized by the affiliated university.
- The teachers conduct Bridge Course for students at entry level to fill the gap between previous course knowledge and perspective subjects. The teachers regularly use modern teaching aids, PPT, with traditional chalk and blackboard method, ICT devices for effective delivery of Curriculum. The library provides all the necessary facilities to teaching staff and students such as reference books, access to e-books through Digital Library and it has generated INFLIBNET and N-LIST subscription.
- The institution adheres well-defined process for the conduct of Continuous Internal Assessment in the college by conducting Internal Assessment Tests. It is monitored by Examination Committee which is transparent and more robust. First Internal Test is conducted on 8th week after commencement of each semester and Second Internal Test is conducted on 12th week for CBCS and Non CBCS batch. The marks are distributed for seminars, assignments and attendance. For NEP students the institution follows the guidelines as prescribed by the University. All Internal Assessment Question Papers are prepared based on the University format. Conduct of practical IA Test is carried out after completion of the practical syllabi. Record of all the CIA is regularly uploaded to the affiliated university website OASIS and UUCMS after the notification is issued by the same university.

#### 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

# 2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

### **Response:**

As per the guidelines of the affiliated university, the institution systematically conducts internal and external assessment to enhance the performance and regularity of the students.

The institution has transparent mechanism for internal and external examinations of both theory and practicals.

• The academic calendar is prepared by the affiliated university and the same is brought to the notice of the college, which schedules the academic activities including external examination in that particular year.

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- Based on University Calendar, IQAC prepares an academic calendar of events which compiles the academic and non-academic events and internal examination in that particular semester.
- The college constitutes examination committee for smooth conduct of internal and external examination. Internal Test schedule is prepared by the examination committee.
- I Internal Assessment test is conducted for 20 marks and reduced to 4 marks, II Internal Assessment test is conducted for 40 marks and reduced to 10 marks. 3 marks are for assignment and 3 marks for attendance of the student. The total theory Internal Assessment marks will be 20 marks for Non-CBCS and CBCS batch. I-Internal Assessment test for NEP-2020 batch is conducted for 20 marks and II-Internal Assessment test is for 20 marks, the total theory Internal Assessment marks will be 40 marks for each subject according NEP-2020 guidelines.
- The teachers are asked to prepare and submit question papers to the examination committee in prescribed dates. The valued answers scripts are shown to the students.
- The students are made aware of their Internal Assessment marks, each student will sign in the consolidated marks list before uploading to the university portal through OASIS.
- After receiving external examination time-table from the university, the principal of the college is appointed as chief of the examination and university will depute an External Chief of the examination for more vigilant about smooth conduct of examination. The institution maintains transparency in internal and external examinations. The college and all the classrooms are under CCTV surveillance for much vigilance.
- After completing every day examination, answer script of the students are sent to the university by post. The results of the external examination will announce by the university after successful completion of evaluation. If student is not satisfied with his/her marks can apply for revaluation/retotaling/challenging revaluation.
- The institution has the system of Grievance Redressal Cell, which receives shortage of attendance of the students due to medical, sports activity, cultural activity, NSS Camp, those students are allowed to attend the internal test which is specially arranged after submission of relevant documents for absence.

- Rani Channamma University, Under NEP-2020 and Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), has revised the curriculum with targeted programme and Course Outcomes of each course and subject.
- The syllabus, Programme, Course Outcomes and the credits allotted to each paper are communicated to first year students during the Bridge Course at the beginning of the semester.
- The students are made familiar with Programme and Course Outcomes through various Orientation workshops, student induction programmes and parents' meet.
- Under NEP-2020 and CBCS system of Rani Channamma University, the UG programme is divided into several Options, containing Core papers, Open Elective papers, Ability Enhancement course, Skill Enhancement course, Subject Enhancement Course papers.
- The Programme outcomes and course outcomes are closely related to the content of curriculum. Teachers design Teaching Plans for all the course and subjects at the commencement of each semester to ensure that the pedagogy in accord with POs.
- The students are encouraged to imbibe the Programme and Course outcomes through participation in curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.
- The faculty members of the college actively participate in Seminars, Workshops, FDP's and Curriculum meetings organized by the affiliated University to discuss the POs and COs.
- The faculty members adopt various strategies and mechanism for achieving the POs and COs through Bridge course, Special remedial classes, mentor-mentee system and to assist the slow learners.
- The IQAC receives and revises POs and COs every now and then through departmental head meetings and Teaching Plans are submitted by each faculty member. The IQAC suggests the faculty members to map the objectives of the outcome to analyze and document their attainment.

### **Response:**

The infrastructure and physical facilities of the institution has been developed to facilitate the academic improvement and effective mechanism for proper implementation of supportive facilities.

The Campus spans over an area of 8 acres with well planned and spacious building which was built in 48,000 square feet. It has 17 spacious and well-ventilated classrooms. The institution has 14 ICT class rooms, 9 well equipped laboratories and library. A big play ground, well maintained gardens, canteen, R.O. Water Plant, Volleyball Court, Throw ball, Handball, Football, Tenniquoit, Jumping events courts, 400 meters running track, Walker Strips for senior citizens and Greeneries are established and developed to make pollution free and environment friendly.

The college has administrative wing such as Chairman Chamber, Principal Cabin, Guest Room, Pantry Room, Office Room, Class Rooms, Laboratories, General Staff Room, Other Staff Rooms, Library, Reading Room for students, Reading Room for Staff, Examination Section, NSS Office, Amphi theatre, IQAC Room, P.G. Staff Room, Centre for Competitive Exams, Sports Room, Xerox Room, Wash Rooms and Recreation Rooms.

The details of available infrastructure and physical facilities are as follows:

- Classrooms with ICT facility: The institution has 17 spacious and well-ventilated classrooms available with proper seating capacity. Green boards are available to meet traditional teaching methodology. There are 14 classrooms with ICT facilities with modern technology. One computer laboratory has ICT facility. The campus has Wi-Fi facility to help teaching and learning process with both conventional and ICT enabled classrooms.
- Laboratory: The institution has 9 well equipped laboratories to facilitate scientific experiments in the curriculum. Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Computer Science, Math Lab, Commerce Lab, Language Labs with well-Configured computers and internet facility and Digital Lab are designed to promote and simplify practicals of the curriculum. All science department laboratories have sophisticated equipments. Separate software is used at office and library to help and mitigate administrative support.

The institution has cultural activity hall i.e. Dr|| R. H. Kulkarni Auditorium which is spacious and well equipped to conduct Seminars, Conferences and Workshops. This hall can be used for any other activity of the college and Public.

- Green Campus: The institution has green campus with the botanical garden to create environmental experience for learning.
- **Generator and UPS:** To mitigate power inconveniences, the campus has generator of 25 KVE and UPS 20 KVE.
- CCTVs: The campus, Lecture Halls, Auditorium, etc. are under 76 CCTV cameras surveillance.

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- Central Library: To meet students' interest and attention towards access the knowledge, the library installed INFLIBNET, NLIST and Digital Library etc. The central Library of the college has a rich collection of Books, Journals, Magazines, Periodicals & more to fulfill the demands of students and staff.
- Cultural Activities and Yoga: The institution conducted Yoga Camp for 7 days for students and staff in collaboration with Patanjali Yoga Peeth, Athani. The institution celebrates Yoga Day every year on the occasion of International Yoga Day. The Cultural Committee and Mahila Okkoota conduct cultural activities every year on the different occasions to expose their hidden talents. ### 1. Title of the practice:

### **No Vehicle Day**

### 2. Objectives of the Practice

- To raise environmental sensitivity and awareness among students about the vehicular pollution.
- To create awareness about global warming caused by fossil fuel burn and its impact on Indian economy.
- To encourage for using the bicycles and public transportation system
- To save conventional energy sources.
- To reduce the use of fossil fuel.

#### 3. The context:

The world is on the threshold of serious crisis of global warming and climate change. There is a need to spread awareness about the global warming and solution to reduce it. Environmentalists all over the world are raising concerns over the global warming and impact of motor vehicles in emission of poisonous gases. We, at the college level, are doing our own small act by abstaining the vehicles on 2nd and 4th Saturday of every month in our campus.

### 4. The Practice:

To inculcate the habit of using bicycles or public transport, the college has made a rule for every student and faculties not to come to college by vehicle on 2nd and 4th Saturday of every month. All the students, teaching and non-teaching staff working in the college come to the college as pedestrians or via bicycle or by a public transport service. In case any student or staff comes to the campus in their personal petrol vehicle, he or she has to pay penalty of Rs. 100. The reminder notice is being circulated on 2nd and 4th Friday of every month. All entry points into the campus will be closed for vehicles on those days. The physically challenged students are exempted from this initiative. Further during examinations students and staff members are exempted from this practice to avoid any kind of inconvenience.

- They become aware about bad impact of vehicles on the nature.
- Some of the students have purchased electric vehicles.

### 1. Title of the practice:

### **Organic Manure Production – Vermicomposting Method**

### 2. Objectives of the Practice

- To maintain eco-friendly college campus
- To utilize organic waste through earthworms to get vermicompost that is known as Black Gold!
- To aware the students and society on chemical free Vermicompost

### 3. The context:

Vermicompost is the product of the decomposition process using various species of worms to transform organic waste into a nutrient-rich fertilizer containing high amount of nitrogen, potassium, phosphorus, calcium and magnesium, etc. It is a healthy and clean way to eliminate wastes going into our landfills, which improves the environment. Vermicomposting attracted much interest in recent years due to increasing environmental concerns and use of sustainable fertilizers. It is the Eco-friendly method of organic waste management.

### 4. The Practice

College has established vermi composting unit in campus having size 12'X4'X2'and introduced the species of earthworm- Esinia foetida. Organic waste in and around our college campus is collected and used for vermicomposting. Approximate 300 Kg. of vermicompost is produced in single harvest. The duration required for decomposition of organic waste is about 45-50 days. The vermi compost bed is watered regularly and checked frequently to avoid the compost from overheating.

#### 5. Evidence of success:

The Vermicompost collected from our vermicomposting unit has been successfully utilized in our college campus. It is also commercially distributed among the faculties and students at a very nominal cost.

### 6. Problems encountered and Resources required

Vermicompost unit can foster the growth of other bugs and pests that are present in the starter soil, bedding or worm food. To avoid this faculty members monitors it frequently.

Being unaided institution, it has its own beautiful college building, an auditorium and big play ground. It has 17 spacious and well-ventilated classrooms, 9 well equipped laboratories and spacious library. This is possible because of magnanimous donors, Smt. Sudha Murthy, Trustee, Infosys Foundation, Bangaluru has donated Rs. 50,00,000 for construction of Dr. R. H. Kulkarni Auditorium which is named after her father and donated Rs. 25,00,000 to college library. Shri Krishnarao Annarao Lokapur who was one of the prominent alumni donated huge amount of Rs. 50,00,000 for construction of degree college building. Shri D. B. Pawar Desai, Ex. PWD Minister, Govt. of Karnataka, donated 8 acres land to J. E. Society, which is valued more than Rs. 10 Crores at present. Out of 10 acres land 2 acres of land was utilized to construct S. S. Girls High School, Shri K. A. Lokapur Arts, Science and Commerce College and Dr. R. H. Kulkarni Auditorium Hall and 6 acres of land utilized for spacious playground which is named after late Shri Shrimant Bhojaraj Pawar Desai (Mangasulikar).
